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

Required Software:

Since this is a course, in creating Web pages, you'll need a computer and a Web browser. You need to have access to the Internet, and your browser should be Firefox, Chrome, Safari or Internet Explorer. You are required to use a simple text editor to create your files in this class - Notepad (Windows) or TextEdit (Mac) - and these are applications that are already on your computer. The use of Word, Dreamweaver, FrontPage, or any other WYSIWYG HTML tool is not allowed.

We will also be using Free Hosting Cloud, which is a free website hosting service that will allow you to upload your pages to the internet for viewing purposes. To upload your website files to your server space, you will be using FileZilla,"FTP" (File Transfer Protocol) software which is free. FileZilla can be used by both Windows and Mac users. Please visit the following links to get set up.

To obtain your free hosting account, please visit this link: <http://www.freehostingcloud.com> Use the second option at the bottom of the page for obtaining a free account. Once you finish the checkout part, you will receive an email informing you of your account details. This email includes your ftp user information. DO NOT delete this email. You will need it to set up your FileZilla software. Also, you may want to keep this free hosting to use for upcoming classes, or for personal use.

To download and install the FileZilla software, please visit this link: <http://filezilla-project.org>. Once downloaded, go through the steps of installing the program.
